# **ON-LINE PRESCRIPTIONS**

We have signed a contract with Vision computer services and are currently collecting patient's e-mail addresses for those who want to register on-line to order their repeat prescriptions. # **TEST RESULTS**

## **MEASLES VACCINATION**

Following the recent Measles outbreak in England there has been a campaign to ensure that all patients under 25 years of age are fully vaccinated. If you think you or your child requires vaccination please contact the practice for further advice. Parents of pre-school children can also contact the health visitor.

## **ROTAVIRUS VACCINATION**

Rotavirus is a virus that causes gastroenteritis (diarrhea and vomiting illness). A vaccination is to be introduced some time from July 2013. This vaccine will be offered routinely to all infants aged 2 months and again at 3 months (that is, 2 doses 4 weeks apart) when they attend for their first and second routine childhood immunization. This vaccine is given in the form of oral drops. Further information will be available from health professionals and children will automatically be called for vaccination by the health board along with the other routine childhood immunizations. It is hoped that the vaccine will also be introduced for the elderly population thereafter.
